

## **Nigel Webb**

I have the sad task of passing on the news that Nigel Webb passed away on the 27th April.

I had received an email from him just two weeks ago giving his apologies for another get together I had organised with some colleagues in the area. He told me of an illness he had been receiving treatment for since September 22 and that he had just been released from hospital.

I was surprised to hear from John Discombe and Alan Hall that he had died during the weekend. It seems that the cancer had returned with aggression.

I remember Nigel arriving at Killerton in 1972. During our first dinner we were sat in the dining room and I noticed Nigel sat on an adjacent table. He was wearing a Portsmouth Technical High School tie. My old school! As dinner finished I went across to him and asked where he had got the tie from. His reply "Well – went there didn't I – mush". The final word indicated a true Portsmuthian and the authenticity of his background.

After leaving Luke's in'73 I started teaching at a school in Gosport and alongside maths I started teaching Computer Studies. Two years later I discovered that Nigel was now teaching in the area and he too was teaching Computer Studies. We were both following a CSE syllabus that necessitated us have regular moderation meetings so we met quite frequently for a number of years until GCSEs came along.

After a couple of years teaching Nigel moved to Springfield School in Portsmouth where he continued teaching Computer Studies, but as the years progressed he moved his focus on to helping with the school timetable, taking over the full task in later years and eventually inheriting the role of Assistant Head Teacher.

John Discombe bumped into Nigel by chance a few years ago when they were drawn as playing partners in a golf match. Chatting during the game they realised that they were both teachers, had been at Luke's and also at Killerton.

John closes with "he was a lovely man and he will be sadly missed by his family and his golfing buddies at Chichester Golf Club"
