

Key Fact	Tie worn by a St Luke's student while resident at Killerton
Short Description	Killerton was used as a Hall of Residence between 1963 and 1976 for students from St Luke's College Exeter. The tie bears the Acland crest of a falcon on a gloved hand.



Killerton was occupied by students from St Luke's College, Exeter between 1963 and 1976, which at that time was a teacher training college. The students clearly hold fond memories of their time in the house – there is an active website (<https://killerton-memories.co.uk>) for former students and some of them return to Killerton every year to visit and take on Broadclyst Cricket Club. The tie was deigned by the students and worn when they were in residence. It features the Acland crest of a falcon on a gloved hand which can be seen in the full coat of arms displayed on Sir Thomas 10<sup>th</sup> baronet's funeral hatchment. It also appears on some of the family silver.



Here is a small collection of photographs from the time. In the second a group is having dinner with the Aclands in their flat on the first floor of Killerton. The third shows that the tie was not the only item of branded clothing worn by the students.
