How blacks could benefit from Spanish recipes

IT IS reported that black parents could help their children educationally rather more than they do. This spring, in Los Angeles, I met a remarkable woman, Marnesba Tackett, who is enabling the parents of similarly disadvantaged Spanish-speak-ing children to do exactly

There are two essentials. (1) The first approach to the parents must not be made by teachers. The class gap is too great. If we wanted to follow Mrs Tackett we should need to recruit literate out-going youngish men and women from amongst the black unemployed of Brixton. These have to become the permanent friends of the

parents.
(2) These black friends of black parents would need what Mrs Tekett called "recipes" — duplicated "recipes" — duplicated simple instructon sheets to show the paints how to help. Apart from the intangible benefits, he gain in straight readil achievement is significant.

It would cost money but it would work. I have single copies of ten of the "recipes" and could send copies to anyone who sends me £1 with large SAE. Please allow three weeks for reply. - Yours sincerely,
